## 10-MW solar thermal plant to be set up at IISc.

**BANGALORE:** Here is a ray of hope for the unrelenting power crisis in the State. It comes in the form of a solar thermal plant soon to be established at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc).

### Pact

The IISc and the Centre for Study of Science, Technology and Policy (CSTEP), a think tank that focuses on technology and policy for human development, on Monday entered into an agreement to research, design and develop a 10 MW solar thermal power plant. The memorandum of agreement also includes the development of a "smart grid" that utilises modern digital technologies to improve efficiency, stability and management of the electricity system.

The solar thermal plant — which will be connected to the grid — will employ parabolic trough technology

which uses steam to run a turbine generator and generate energy. The 10 MW plant will be the largest of its kind in the country, said Anshu Bharadwaj, director of CSTEP.

K. Chattopadhyay, Divisional Chair of Mechanical Sciences at IISc, said that the project is estimated to cost Rs. 150 crore and will be funded by the Union Government with financial input from the industry. The plant is expected to be in place within the next five years.

### Suitable

The "smart grid" project at IISc will serve as a test bed to demonstrate and innovate different technologies in the field and adapt them to fit the Indian context. This technology is especially important for India where transmission and distribution losses are high, voltage fluctuations frequent and electricity supply is far behind the rapidly growing demand, said Dr. Bharadwaj.
